

Alongside this, we Disabilities carried out website accessibility checks with the Smart Accessibility Tool for Your Applications (SATYA) to identify digital **3 DECEMBER** barriers and improve online experience for diverse users. 2551 total audits including digital and physical audits were conducted in one single day by the APD team. These combined efforts aim to ensure that physical spaces and digital platforms are usable,



with an extraordinary score of 95%. Fieldwork exposed him to the realities faced by families of children with disabilities, misconceptions, stigma and a lack of early awareness. "Most families don't lack love," he reflects. "They lack information. Awareness is the first intervention." Today, Hanumantharaya serves as a Senior Therapist in the community, guiding parents who are navigating uncertainty. He identifies developmental delays, connects families to services, and offers reassurance grounded in lived experience and professional skill. "People trust me now," he says with quiet pride. "They know I stand with them." Hanumantharaya's journey embodies IDRR's mission, empowering individuals to become catalysts of change, strengthening communities through knowledge and compassion.


